





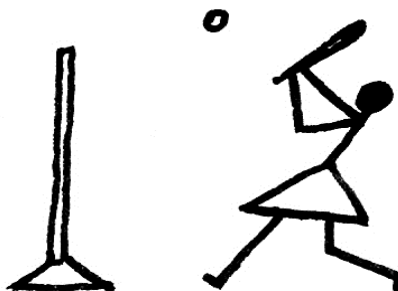

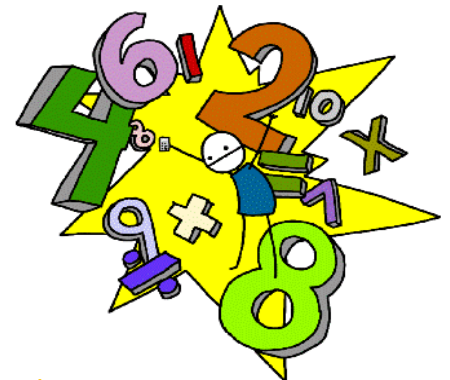

RHPA Overview

Whilst it's hard to believe the Summer holidays are upon us, the PA has enjoyed a productive and rewarding year, with various events being held throughout. Our aim has been to arrange events which raise funds for the school and for charity, while also connecting the school, parents and community in a positive way.

The Easter Egg-stravaganza was held for the first time and was a great success, with Easter egg hunts, crafts and plenty of chocolate and hot cross buns ensuring a good time was had by all.

The Year 6-8 film and pizza night, school disco for Years 2-5, quiz and curry night for parents and the Christmas fair were also popular and successful events.



Rose Hill's first ever Summer Festival, complete with dog show, was the RHPA's main and also last event of the school year, and saw everyone getting into the festival spirit and enjoying the old and new stalls, food and activities, with the rain only enhancing the festival vibe!

All the events above could not go ahead without the hard work and invaluable help of the grounds staff - Ron, Ben, Ken and John - and Kathryn and Ann in the office. A massive thank you must go to all of them. Thanks also to the enthusiastic and imaginative members of the PA who have put in a huge amount of time and effort planning and holding these events, and to the parents, staff and children of Rose Hill who have supported us so well!



This year has seen a big change to the RHPA, with Claire Archbold and Debbie George stepping down after several years of brilliantly running things, although Debbie still remains firmly involved. Claire and Debbie deserve a massive round of applause for the huge amount of work they have put into the PA almost singlehandedly over the years.

The format of the PA changed in the Summer term to spread the workload a bit more evenly, with Mary Stoner bravely taking on the role of PA coordinator heading up a team of mainly new volunteers, although more are always welcome!

The PA raised £4,570 this year, of which a percentage will go to the School Council's chosen charity, Nourish food bank. The remainder will be put towards future school projects which will benefit the pupils, such as last year's refurbishment of the top play area.
