### SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDER

It was lovely to see so many impeccably dressed pupils returning to school last Wednesday, and it is hoped that such a high-standard of dress will endure throughout the year; pupils set such an important example in representing the school. With this in mind we appeal for your support. The following extract (largely taken from the Parent Handbook) highlights aspects upon which our expectations are particularly are high.

Children should be encouraged to take a pride in their appearance as follows:

- Shoes should be cleaned regularly
- Hair should be kept tidy and trendy styles avoided please. Girls must use hair clips or bands to keep long hair off the face. These must be white, pink or brown and of a plain design.
- Girls in year 7/8 have a privilege on a Friday to wear a slightly different style but must continue to be neat and off their faces
- Bags; in Years 3-5 children should use a black school bag. In Years 6-8 children can choose their own bags but we advise the use of rucksacks and they should be of a sensible colour. (Handbags are not permitted)
- Watches may be worn from Year 2 and must be named – they are not, however, really necessary.

20's Plenty is a nationwide scheme to implement a 20 mph speed limit of vehicles in residential streets and town centres. It has already been implemented in a number of towns across the UK.

Kent County Council is proposing to introduce a 20mph speed limit in St John's, Tunbridge Wells, which is wonderful news given the high number of schools in that area – details at [http://consultations.kent.gov.uk/consult.ti/20mph\\_TunWells/consultationHome](http://consultations.kent.gov.uk/consult.ti/20mph_TunWells/consultationHome).

We expect this to be the first phase in making all residential streets in Tunbridge Wells 20mph. To ensure that this 20mph zone is implemented, KCC needs to see support from residents. It is important that you express your support to KCC before the consultation closes on **30<sup>th</sup> September**. Please can you:
