**BIG Garden Birdwatch** Everything you need to know to do the Big Garden Birdwatch **28-30 January 2017**

## How

Here's what you need to do to be a Big Garden Birdwatch citizen scientist on 28, 29 or 30 January 2017.

- 1 Choose a time of day that's convenient for you. You'll probably see more birds if you do it early in the morning, but any time of day you can do it is useful for us. To make it easier for you, we've extended the event to three days.
- 2 Make yourself comfortable and watch the birds in your garden for an hour.
- 3 Record the highest number of each bird species that you see at any one time. Then answer the other questions about other wildlife species that visit your garden during the year.
- 4 Don't worry if you don't see anything over the hour, as it's still really useful information.

## BEDE'S GALACTIC CHALLENGE

Nine pupils from Years 7 & 8, accompanied by Mr Izzard and Mr Mansfield, attended the fantastic Galactic Challenge Day at Bede's school on Saturday 14th January. The day saw us join with two other schools to form Astrodyne Merkon, a company that had been asked to design and propose a mining facility on the surface of Mercury in 2087AD. There were another two companies made up from four other schools. The purpose of the day is to set an impossible task, in an impossible time frame with technology that doesn't exist and is set 70 years in the future.



The pupils had to use all their maths, engineering and science skills as well as their ICT, communication, art and design and personal interaction skills to come close to completing the task. At the end of a very gruelling 4 ½ hours the company had to make their presentation in front of a panel of judges including the founder of the UK Space Design Competition on which this challenge is based plus about 150 parents and siblings – no pressure! All our pupils pitched in with the work and helped the company to give a very clear and detailed proposal including the most realistic costing for the project.

*Our group quickly got to work. I was in charge of interior financing. It was a rush at the end but we managed to get it all done on time. We were the first up doing our presentation and it went really well! The second company won with the idea of 3D printing all their resources.*

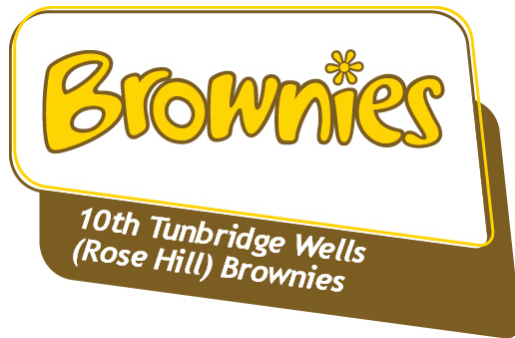
*It was extremely good fun and it really put our maths and science to the test. Our group did not win but we all learnt something and had a great time.*
