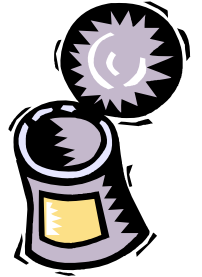


Please note that our Harvest Festival Assembly is on

As usual, at harvest time, we collect all your donations (Pre-Prep and Prep School) and distribute them to locally.

Mr Skottowe and some of the School Council, will deliver all your donations.



Please consider the following when making your donation:

- Tinned or dried foods - fruits, rice pudding & custard, tinned vegetables, tinned meat, pasta milk, (long life & dried). Tinned food must have at least 6 months left on the 'sell by' date as the food needs to be stored for a long time before being used throughout the year.
- Treats such as biscuits, chocolate, coffee, tea and sauces etc.
- Fresh produce (Fruit/ vegetables etc).

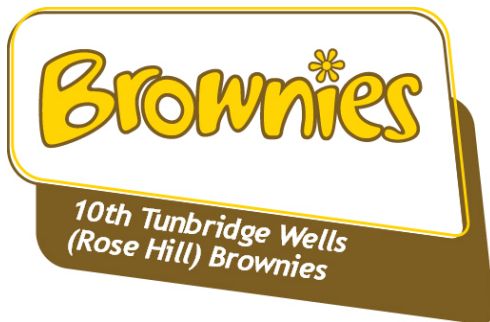
