At the heart of every ShelterBox is a family-sized disaster relief tent. It is custom made for ShelterBox by Vango one of the leading tent manufacturers, and is designed to withstand extreme temperatures, winds up to 100 mph and heavy rainfall. Internally, each tent has privacy partitions that allow families to divide the space as they see fit.
