### CONSULTATION EVENING APPOINTMENTS

Please be advised that confirmation of your appointment time for the Parents' Consultation Evening will be sent home in your child's book bag today.



From previous experience we know Year 1 and 2 boys will be challenged with their shirt buttons, especially the top collar button, and tying their own school tie after half term when winter uniform must be worn. It will be really helpful if you can spend some time over half term practising these skills with your child. Buttons may need to be re-adjusted to leave room for little fingers. (In many cases buttons have been sewn on too tightly.)

May we also ask that you take the opportunity over half term to ensure your child's hair meets school expectations. A reminder from the Parents Handbook— *Hair should be kept tidy and trendy styles avoided please. Girls must use hair clips or bands to keep long hair off the face. These must be plain white, pink or brown in colour and hairbands should be narrow.* Winter weather may be with us from November so please ensure fleece hat, gloves and scarf are clearly named.
