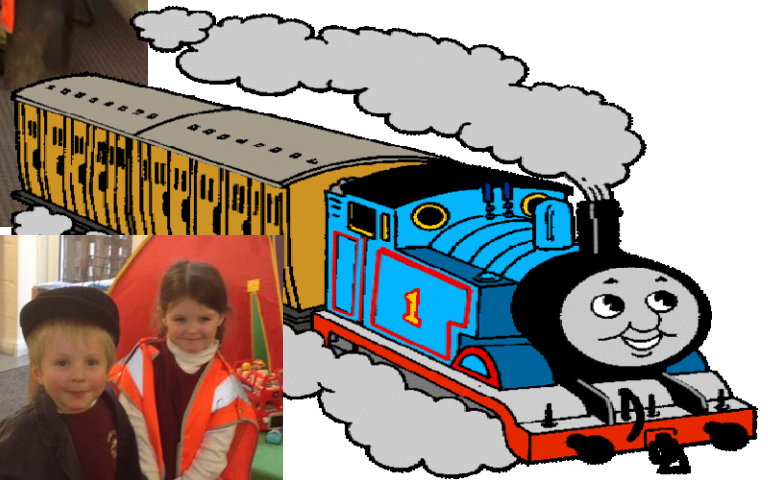

The Spring Term is going to be a very busy one.

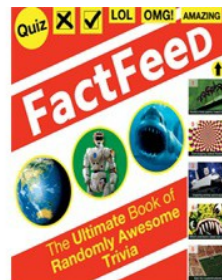
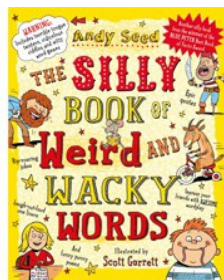
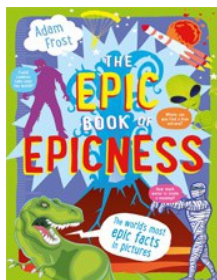
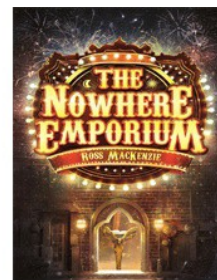
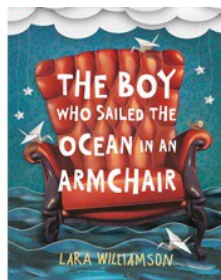
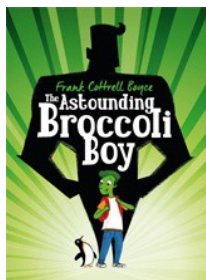
